
What is PBIS?

PBIS is a research based behavioral framework that schools use to improve school safety and promote positive behavior. All PBIS practices are founded on the assumption and belief that all children can exhibit appropriate behavior when they know and have been taught what the expectations are. PBIS will support students by directly teaching behavioral and academic expectations just as subjects like Math and Science would be taught.




"The purpose of PBIS is to teach behavioral expectations and behavioral expectations for following reward students for following them."


WHAT PARENTS DO

TO ENCOURAGE POSITIVE BEHAVIOR...





Participate in child's school learning and activities.



Use SKYWARD regularly to view and discuss child's attendance, assignments, grades, and test scores.

Be a visible part of Memphis Jr/Sr High School by attending parent meetings and conferences.

Talk to your child about the behavior and academic expectations at school.

Ask your child about their school day.

Help child work through conflicts.

Contact the school when needing help.

Encourage positive behavior and academic success.

WHAT MEMPHIS STAFF WILL DO TO PROMOTE

APPROPRIATE BEAHVIOR....

Connect with students in order to avoid inappropriate behaviors.

Teach appropriate behavior along with academic content.

Practice and model expected behaviors

Reteach behaviors throughout the school year.

Follow a 3-Step process for managing classroom behavior:

1.) Classroom reset: student will be given a private reminder of expectations.

 Reset #2: Hallway conversation. The student will meet with teacher privately/briefly to correct behavior. Phone call/contact with parent and classroom discipline.

 Continued disruptive behavior in that class period/the following days results in a Reflection Room referral

THIS WILL ALLOW TEACHERS TO:

Regain teaching time instead of managing behaviors.

Improve the school climate for students and staff.
